- Was carried out in 17,473 villages
- Covered 350,232 households, 562,305 children (aged 3-16)
- All-India enrolment up for all age groups since 2014
- Private school enrolment unchanged for children (6-14) at 30.5%
- Govt school enrolment rises in Kerala, Gujarat among children (11-14)
- Private school enrolment up among children (6-14) in Uttarakhand, Arunachal Pradesh. Assam
- Attendance levels above 80% in 12 key States, 50-60% in 5 States
- Improvement in school facilities continues





29.5 per cent), and Assam (from 17.3 per cent to 22 per cent). Nationally, reading ability has improved especially in the early classes in government schools. The proportion of children in Std III who are able to read at least Std I level text has gone up slightly, from 40.2 per cent in 2014 to 42.5 per cent. In almost all States there is some improvement in the arithmetic levels of children in government schools in Std III.
